Across North and East Yorkshire, one act of giving creates ripples that reach far beyond what we can measure.

Thanks to the generosity of individuals, businesses, councils, national government and trusts, Two Ridings has awarded £2.4 million this year to 509 groups and individuals.

But the real impact isn't in the numbers - it's the warmth of a welcome, the spark of confidence in someone once forgotten, and the strength found in community. From food banks to youth clubs, mental health hubs to warm spaces, each group we support helps people feel safe, valued, and connected.

In challenging times, this work transforms people's lives, bringing hope, connection, and dignity. Community groups become lifelines, second homes, and the heart of where people belong.

Behind every ripple is a donor, a supporter, someone who cared enough to give. Two Ridings is proud to be the bridge between that generosity and the community groups creating real, lasting change.

Standing together in crisis

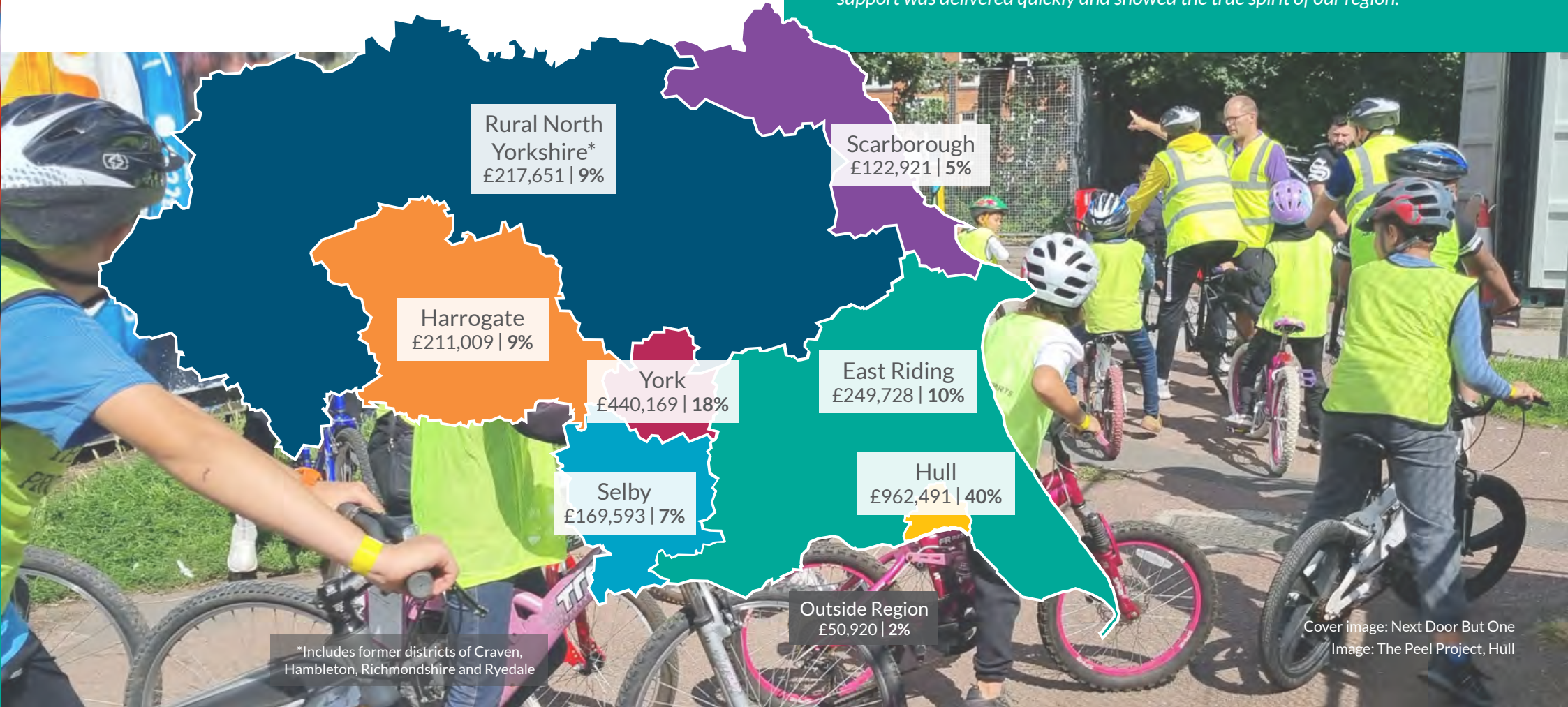
This year, from floods in Ryedale to riots in Hull, Two Ridings stood with community groups on the front lines. We delivered 88 rapid-response grants for flood relief and distributed nearly £40,000 to restore safety and trust in Hull.

In every crisis, community organisations lead, and with swift support, we help them rebuild, heal and strengthen their communities.

Nourishing people in Hull

For many people at St Aidan’s in Southcoates, Hull, the kitchen is more than a place to cook - it’s where lives are rebuilt.

Volunteers serve hundreds through free meals and events, offering purpose and connection to those overcoming addiction, unemployment, or life after prison.

Recent funding for a dishwasher and fridge means they can now support even more people, keeping the heart of the community beating strong.

How Share Skipton is rebuilding community

Since 2024, Share Skipton’s Library of Things has helped locals borrow instead of buy, saving money and reducing waste.

A £10,000 grant funded a Volunteer Coordinator, growing a team of 59 volunteers and launching a Repair Cafe where neighbours fix, learn and connect.

Confidence is growing, skills are building, and a circular economy is thriving - one shared item at a time.

Know your Neighbourhood fund | Creating connection, reducing loneliness

Over three years, the Know Your Neighbourhood Fund supported 14 community organisations in Hull with over £1 million in funding - including £585,000 in this year - to tackle loneliness, boost volunteering, and strengthen community cohesion.

Focused on community-led action, the fund fostered a community of practice, where groups shared learning and built lasting relationships.

This work shows what's possible when communities are trusted and resourced to lead change where they live.

Strong cross-city partnerships built

How a charitable trust found its voice again

This year, a long-standing York trust took a powerful step to honour its original mission—by transferring its assets to the York Community Fund, managed by Two Ridings. After years of finding it hard to stay active, this move breathed new life into the trust’s purpose. Now, its funds are directly supporting local groups tackling inequality, just as the original donor had hoped.

With the admin and outreach taken care of, the trust’s legacy isn’t just being protected, it’s making a real difference, right here, right now.

Creating a legacy of hope in Harrogate

This year a local woman pledged a £1 million legacy, and monthly gifts of £5,000, to THE LOCAL FUND for the Harrogate District, with a focus on supporting children and young people. With expert support from Cooper Park Wealth Management, her generosity is already making a difference and will continue to do so for generations.

This milestone gift strengthens a fund that supports 30+ local groups every year tackling mental health, isolation, and poverty.

How a multi-year grant sows a seed that grows, and then blossoms

Charlie, 22, had long struggled with barriers to work, due to autism, until he found Park House Barns in 2024. Starting as a volunteer in the chocolate studio, he soon secured a paid role with tailored support. His confidence has soared, and his family couldn’t be prouder.

Charlie’s story is part of the Chocolate Academy, a vocational programme from Autism Plus. Thanks to three-year funding from the Bettys & Taylors Family Fund, young adults with autism and learning disabilities are gaining skills, purpose, and pathways into employment, both now and for years to come.



Powering local change with community benefit funds

From Bridlington’s coast to the heart of the Dales, Two Ridings is working with wind farm providers to turn energy sector investment into real, local impact. Through community benefit funds, we’re helping grassroots projects thrive - fixing village halls, building playgrounds, supporting youth clubs, and backing green initiatives that protect our environment.

It’s a simple, powerful model: giving back to the communities hosting renewable energy and helping them grow stronger, greener, and more connected for the future.



Rooted locally, creating change together

At Two Ridings, we know that lasting change starts locally - with people who know their communities and care deeply about making a difference.

Our small, dedicated team of eleven is rooted in the region, bringing together local knowledge, professional expertise, and first-hand experience of the challenges people face. Every day, we listen and respond to what matters most, working closely with hundreds of local organisations to make a meaningful difference.

We're proud to partner with donors, turning their generosity into meaningful impact by ensuring every gift reaches where it's needed most. Guided by a board of 16 experienced trustees and supported by nearly 100 volunteers, our work is strengthened by insight, accountability, and a shared commitment to fairness.

Together - with our donors, partners, and communities - we're not just funding change. We're part of it.

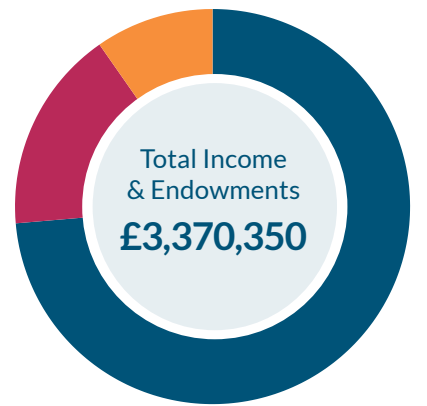

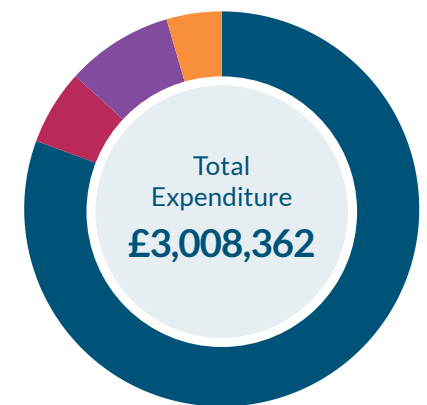

How flexible funding helped transform a youth club, and a town

When Thirsk Youth Club received £9,000 in unrestricted funding, we expected progress. What we saw was transformation.

In just a few months, young people discovered a lifeline - a safe, welcoming space where they could connect, grow, and thrive.

The organisation gained stability, complying with vital regulations, securing new premises, and laying the foundation for a sustainable future.

And across the town, the impact was clear: local police reported a drop in anti-social behaviour, and a renewed sense of pride began to take root in the community.

Unrestricted funding didn't just support a programme. It strengthened the whole community.

As one team member shared:

"We're told by the town council and police that the Youth Club is making a big difference. We see it too - in the children's behaviour, wellbeing, and smiles. This funding didn't just help us. It gave the whole town a lift."
